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Welcome to Term 4

They used to say that Term 4 was always the most relaxing term of the school year. Things were always more mellow, so they said, in the run-up to the end of the year and the growing excitement of the coming Christmas holidays. I wonder where those days have gone? Year 12 of 2011 are, of course, sitting their HSC exams, with all the attendant stress and worry they create – for their teachers too! In their final week of school last term, the students raised \$4020.35 at their Fundraising Day, from which they donated \$2900.00 to the Accident and Emergency Ward at the Armidale Hospital, and \$1000.00 to the school as their school gift. This will be used to help pay for the improvements to the school entry, including the new DUVAL metal lettering for the facing wall.

Meanwhile, the incoming Year 12 is already deeply engrossed in their first term of the HSC course. Parents will be aware that the successful candidates for the incoming Prefect group of 2012 were announced at the Year 12 Valedictory on the 23rd of September. To allow us to formally recognise these students, we will be presenting the Prefects once again at our assembly on Friday the 4th of November, commencing at 12.45pm. You may not be aware, however, that the Prefects attended a Leadership Training Day at Thalgarrah Environmental Education Centre on Friday 28th of October. As a result of the activities undertaken on that day, the Prefects themselves elected the Captains and Vice-Captains who will lead the school in 2012. The Captains and Vice-Captains will be formally announced and presented with their badges at this assembly.

Year 10 is in the build-up phase of preparation for their School Certificate exams, the last such set of external exams to be held. They are also the first Year 10 to come under the new school leaving age legislation, which means that, unlike their predecessors, they no longer finish school a week earlier than other years, but that they are expected to attend school until the last day for all students, Friday 16th December.

We recently had our biannual audit in the Vocational Education and Training (VET) subjects of Hospitality and Metals & Engineering, with many areas of commendation, but also some areas for improvement which we are already working on. Meanwhile, Ms Cullen, Mr Boon and their enthusiastic team have been busy conducting the transition process for Year 6 into Year 7, leading up to the Year 6 Orientation Day on Thursday 3rd November. This is always a great day, and I'm really looking forward to seeing all of the Year 6 students here, learning about Duval High School. On another high note, the school choral group and selected musicians and vocalists also travelled to Sydney for the Celebration Choir at the Sydney Town Hall – Ms Pearson and Mr Ryan tell me that they were very proud of the conduct and performances of our students, and I congratulate them all! Our new key program, Positive Behaviour for Learning, progresses slowly but consistently, with more staff being trained, and student involvement increasing. The SRC has already been involved in a matrix-forming session. The committee meets on Wednesday (Day 3 of the timetable) at 3.30pm in the staff common room, and any interested parents are most welcome to come along.

Finally, I was surprised and delighted to receive a donation of \$650 worth of gift vouchers (at the Armidale Tree Group) from the recent Class of 2001 Year 12 reunion, to help us purchase native trees to replace those being removed from the playground for safety reasons. A \$50 voucher from Robin's Kitchen was also donated, and was gratefully received by the Food Technology teachers.
